

Emergency Response to Opioid Overdose



Scan to access
step-by-step
video instructions

1. Try to wake the person up

- Lay individual on their back
- Shake them
- Talk loudly to arouse them



2. Call for help



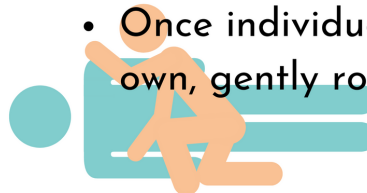
3. Administer naloxone

- Insert device in 1 nostril
- Click plunger to allow medication to be released
- If not responsive after 3 minutes, administer second dose in opposite nostril



4. Stay until help arrives

- Continue to check for breathing
- If they are not breathing, administer rescue breaths
- Once individual is breathing on their own, gently roll them on their side



Naloxone is a medication approved by the FDA designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose.

The effects of naloxone are temporary and it is critical to call 911 to ensure the person's safety.
